Dear Judge Ben H Brooks III,

I am a Law Enforcement Lieutenant of 27 years of service who has a son who is attending college in Mobile Alabama. Jonathan Nakhla was my sons saving grace when he started college in his freshmen year. I am writing to you because the person that was portrayed in your courtroom as a privileged and selfish man is not the man that Jonathan Nakhla truly is. So, I am sending you this letter so you can hear about the real person that he is. My sons first few weeks into college were fun but then everything started to go really wrong. My son is an athlete on scholarship and he also is taking up Pre-health studies which we know as Pre-med. About the sixth week into school my son came home to Louisiana and was overwhelmed with college. When I say overwhelmed I mean Rock-bottom. As a parent I supported my son and told him we will make this work. I then reached out for tutors in Mobile. The first week It cost me a fortune trying different tutors and it was not working. I then came across Johnathan Nakhla who was offering online tutoring. I contacted him and told him my situation and that my son needed in-person tutoring. Mr Nakhla agreed and set up a time. I was aware of his charges against him but as a mother and professional I did research. I found Mr Nakhla had done many outstanding things even as far as not charging for surgeries on patients. He has gone out the country to help with the needy even as far as teaching students. So, upon my decision I then placed my faith in God and followed what I had been taught.

I allowed Johnathan to tutor my son the first day. Johnathan called me afterwards and told me that Trace had not learned the basic of Chemistry and that he will have to teach him all of it to get him on track. Johnathan and my son worked constantly being many days/weekends and long hours. By the end of his first semester Johnathan had my son up to an A in Chemistry. But what was so special about all of this is what happened outside of the tutoring. My

son came out of his shell. Johnathan was mentoring my child and encouraging him to accomplish new things in life. You have to understand; my son was a very shy child who was a homebody. In that first semester with Johnathan, my son started volunteering in Alabama with Special Olympics, going to different churches with his friends from University of Mobile and leading his bowling team as a Captain. He helps the Coach recruit new bowlers. My son was a changed person who was outgoing and I didn't have to hover over him. My son transformed that semester and his family could clearly see it. All this was with the help of Johnathan Nakhla and his encouragement. Johnathan Nakhla is also a man of Christian faith. My Son, Trace enjoyed this being he loves God and loves to be around people who loves God. Johnathan has watch over my son and even made sure he got back to his dorm when he was out late at night studying. Johnathan Nakhla had never stopped helping him. I want you to know that during the trial Jonathan was still tutoring my son after he got home from court. Johnathan always places others before himself. He is not a Privileged or Selfish man and it was hurtful to hear that from people who didn't even know him. Johnathan had become more to my family then a tutor he became a friend. My son started out wanting to be a Pharmacist, but now he is inspired to attend medical school. It has been heart breaking that all the people Johnathan was helping up to the day he was taken into custody will no longer be able to receive his help. You need to know that Johnathan Nakhla has the ability to inspire people and encourage them to believe in themselves. Honorable Judge Brooks I am asking you to understand Johnathan Nakhla is a good loving person and please do not judge the rest of his life, his two son's life, his family's life and all that still need him because of those few minutes that went wrong that night. It was not planned, it was not intentional, it was truly an accident. I hope you can consider that Johnathan can offer so much to society and I pray you give him that chance.
